### From the Desk of the State President

Officer Training is now available and free till June 30. Keep in mind that you must complete your officer training by June 30 or you are not considered an officer. Nominations are being accepted for the State Board. Send your letter of intent and resume to State Secretary Dale Johnson at Lodge1168@mooseunits.org by June 15.

Registration is now open for the convention August 18-22 at the Kewadin Hotel in Sault Sainte Marie. The attendance at all meetings (international, state, district) is mandatory for all lodges by the President and Administrator. Absenteeism may result in your lodge to be considered not in good standing. This would have the effect of your lodge not being able to vote, have a member run for office, host a function or meeting and be reflected in your per capita.

Speaking of per capita, the billing should be coming out in the next few weeks. Keep in mind that the billing will reflect counts for the men and women members of your lodge. Also, the per capita rates will reflect you're your attendance at meetings as well as your participation in state programs, membership and retention goals. Outdoor Sports activities are now in full swing at the state and lodge level. Plan on attending and supporting these functions in the further pursuit of fraternalism and well -just plain fun!

Please be aware that a chapter member whose dues were expired as of April 30 is considered to be an expired lodge member as of May 1. As an expired lodge member, they will need to pay lodge dues (not just chapter) to be reinstated. Also, as with any expired member, they have lost their social quarter privileges and may not enter with their spouse as a guest for one year.





## Your Government at work:

**Covid-19 is still in the headlines**, but thankfully this last virus outbreak is subsiding. As the number of Michigan citizens get vaccinated and the covid positivity rate drops our current restrictions will be lessened. We may or may not get State or Federal Covid-19 vaccination cards. This idea is in the initial planning stages. I found two recent articles that address this issue.

## 1. Michigan to lift all outdoor capacity restrictions June 1, eyes full reopening July 1

All indoor capacity restrictions will be set at 50%, including for indoor dining, weddings, graduations; mask, gathering restrictions to lift July 1. # 2. Whitmer, lawmakers reach broad deal that includes scrapping permanent COVID-19 work rules

The broader compromise gives lawmakers more authority on future pandemic orders and the governor a bigger voice on budget negotiations. 4. Everyone knows how difficult it is for businesses to hire employees. This applies to us as well as the commercial sector. Please so your part to help out at your Lodges. Don't become part of the problem by complaining about slow service. Get up off your chair and order a drink at the bar. Clean off a table on the way back to yours or ask if you can help with dishes. There are measures being taken at the State and Federal level to alleviate this problem, but until it is resolved, be Moose Proud and become part of the solution, not the problem.

- 3. Here is a summary of HB4431. When Director Kalm changed the gaming rules for poker rooms and Bingo he limited the number of events that could be held at a venue each day, had a huge negative impact on poker rooms and Bingo Halls. This proposed Legislation would remove the word "occasion" which would mean the number of events in a day would revert to the original definition of an event. That would open Bingo and poker rooms for more events. The proposed legislation is up for the third reading on the floor means it will be voted on soon.
- 4. Please make sure you file your IRS 990-N postcard, 990 EZ or 990. There is some confusion about our tax exempt status. We are exempt from tax on income related to our "purpose" as a Fraternal organization which is why we stress that income from Lodge and Chapter fundraising events is categorizes as "Special Project and Committee Income". If you use "Other Income" and don't specify the source, the IRS could view it as "unrelated income" which is taxable.

We are not exempt from sales tax on resale of merchandise and Social Quarter sales.

We will have a detailed report for you at our Annual Convention.
